I will, with God's help.

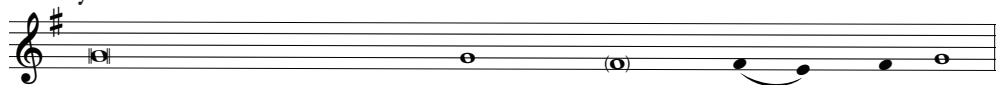
Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?
